For years, I dabbled around aimlessly on the spiritual path .It was only when I found the tradition and path of Sri Vidya that my heart and mind finally settled into a sadhana /spiritual practice with so much intensity that it bore great spiritual fruits of unconditional love, bliss and clarity. Whenever I think of Sri Lalita Maha Tripura Sundari (The blissful divine mother of the cosmos)my heart melts like butter placed on a hot stove and my eyes brim and overflow with tears of devotion and gratitude . I always felt that there was no juice of devotion in my spiritual practice . It was only when I connected with the divine feminine that I could express and receive love, develop true compassion and gentleness in my otherwise detached and indifferent persona. True detachment is a total blossoming of love and total involvement without any expectation . Wanting unconditional love is the biggest condition . To receive love, one has to first embody and share it because we become love incarnate when we strip away the layers of illusion . Divine mother/Kundalini automatically by her grace takes you to the state of total spiritual emancipation. This whole world of illusory images is her creation and by surrendering at her lotus feet, she will ferry you across the ocean of samsara into a state of transcendental bliss where all sense of separation dissolves and this world of suffering is seen as the most beautiful dance of life . She will fulfil all your desires; both spiritual and material but it is best to invoke her for spiritual liberation . Ma Tripura Sundari is a very gentle and extremely loving deity but can be fierce too in helping you confront your shortcomings and layers of ignorance. The love of Ma Kali, Ma Tara and other fierce forms of divine mother has its own sweetness and flavour but for a householder who is entangled in his worldly responsibilities and attachments, their ways can be overwhelming sometimes . Thus, the worship of Man Tripura Sundari is great for householders. Having said that, many monks also practice Sri Vidya but the intensity and way of worship is slightly different . It is always best to get initiated by a guru who has got the siddhi(perfection)of the mantra and is associated with a traditional Sri Vidya lineage . I was instructed by a guru who learnt under an adept Sri Vidya practitioner . When he initiated me into the mantra, It almost felt like a seed was implanted in my third eye which would germinate, sprout and mature with years of dedicated practice . I was initiated into panchadasi mantra first, followed by shodasi and finally the mahashodasi mantra . Usually the Bala mantra is

given as the primary initiation . I am ever grateful to my guru for initiating me into this divine and ancient practice .The Sadhana of Sri Vidya can involve worship of the Sri chakra, detailed rituals, various Nyasas and poojas in addition to the saguna upasana(worship of the form of divine mother) and most importantly the devotional and dedicated Japa(mental recital)of her powerful mantras . I have personally not done the poojas and elaborate rituals though they are taught in the lineage in which I was initiated . I mainly visualised the form of divine mother and chanted her divine mantra lakhs of times . I am not very good at sitting for long hours so I made it a practice to keep chanting Mahashodasi mantra throughout the day, although it is best to sit dedicatedly on your asana(spiritual seat) in your meditation room . Eventually the chanting continued in the dreams and was the first thought that popped up in my mind when I woke up . There is hardly any person who is either not conversant with or not heard about occult sciences of which Yantra, Mantra, Tantra and not heard about occult sciences of which Yantra, Mantra, Tantra and forces are simply tributaries. Hindus, Jains, Muslims, ascetics, peers have written a lot about such sciences but only a selected few know how to use such devices ably and safely. Traditionally such symbols are used in Eastern mysticism to balance the mind or focus it on spiritual concepts. The act of wearing, depicting, enacting and/or concentrating on a yantra is held to have spiritual or astrological or magical benefits in the Tantric traditions of the Indian religions. • Shapes and patterns commonly employed in yantra include squares, triangles, circles and floral patterns but may also include more complex and detailed symbols, for instance: • The lotus flower typically represents chakras, with each petal representing a psychic propensity (or vritti) associated with that chakra; • A dot, or bindu, represents the starting point of creation or the infinite, unexpressed cosmos; • The shatkona (?a?ko?a) (Sanskrit name for a Hexagram) is composed of a balance between: • An upwards triangle which according to Tantra denotes energy, or more specifically action and service (seva). It may also denote spiritual aspiration, the element of fire, or Shiva. It is also said to represent the static substratum of the cosmos;[citation needed] • A downwards triangle which according to Tantra denotes spiritual knowledge. It may also denote the creative power of the cosmos, fecundity, the element of water, or Shakti; • A swastika represents good luck, welfare, prosperity or spiritual victory; • Bija mantras (usually represented as characters of Devan?gar? that correspond to the acoustic roots of a particular chakra or vritti). • Geometric element meanings: • Circle = Energy of the element water • Square = Energy of the element earth • Upward-facing Triangle = Energy of the element fire; energy • Downward-facing Triangle = Energy of the element water; knowledge • Diagonal line = Energy of the element air • Horizontal line = Energy of the element water • Vertical line = Energy of the element fire • Point = Energy of the element ether Shri Lalita Trishati, like Lalita Sahasranama is discussed in Lalitopakhyana of Brahmandapurana, which is in the form of conversation between Shri Hayagriva (an incarnation of Vishnu and is considered as the presiding God for knowledge) and sage Agastya, who is a great worshiper of Parashakti through his own Panchadashi mantra which is different from the regular Panchadashi mantra (composed by Manmatha, who is also known as Cupid). Trishata means three hundred. Shri Lalita Trishati consists of three hundred namas, carved out of fifty nine

couplet verses. Shri Lalita Devi has four forms viz. gross form, Kamakala form, Kundalini form, and mantra form. All these forms are explained in Lalita Sahasranama such as kamakala rupa (322), kundalini (110), mantra-sara (846), mahamantra (227). She is worshiped in various gross forms such as Kali, Tara, Gayatri (420), Mahalakshmi (210), etc. Kamakala is Her subtler form, where She remains intimately with Shiva. Her kundalini form is the subtlest of all and if She is made to ascend, She rushes to the top of the head, sahasrara, where She spends intimate moments with Her Lord Shiva. Worshiping Her mantra form is known as Shri Vidya. She represents all letters and words in the form of Shabdabrahman (Lalita Sahasranama 204 sarvamantra-svarupini). Each of Her gross form, such as Kali, Tara, etc as mentioned in Dashamahavidya, is worshipped with different mantras and these worships are known as Tantras. All the three hundred namas have been explained in detail by drawing references from Lalita Sahasranama , Upanishads, Saundaryalahari, Bhagavad Gita, etc. The namas are printed both in English and Sanskrit.
